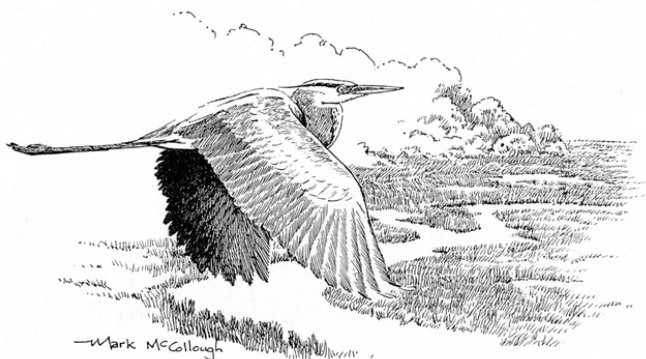


HIGHLAND FARM PRESERVE



Natural History

Welcome to our 150+ acre Highland Farm Preserve! Here, you'll find an extensive trail network through open fields and hilly forests with rock outcrops, vernal pools, historic cemeteries, stone walls, and even a cellar hole. Connecting thousands of acres of conserved land between Mt.

Agamenticus and the York River, this preserve helps protect the quality of water that flows into the York River. It also helps protect Boulter Pond, the body of water located on the northern boundary of the preserve that serves as the drinking water supply for the Town of Kittery and parts of York and Eliot.

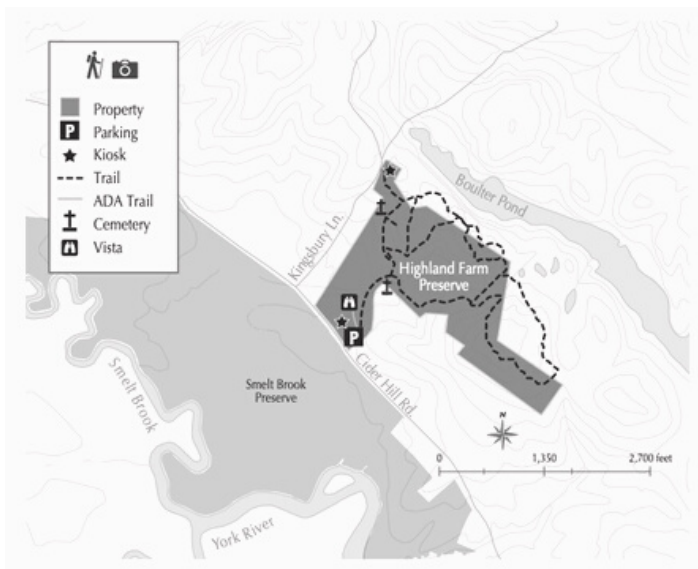
Bringing Back the New England Cottontail



Through a partnership with U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, we are working to restore 30 acres of thickets to support the return of the state-endangered New England cottontail rabbit.

With as few as 300 individuals thought to be left in the state, recovery efforts at Highland Farm Preserve could prove critical to the survival of Maine's only native rabbit.
